



FAYETTEVILLE POLICE DEPARTMENT 2015 Annual Traffic Report

The Fayetteville Police Department is committed to assisting the citizens of Fayetteville in traveling its roadways in a safe and efficient manner. The total number of traffic violations cited increased in 2015, as did the number of motor vehicle collisions. Statistics regarding motor vehicle collision and various traffic violations are noted in the below chart.
