



FAYETTEVILLE POLICE DEPARTMENT 2017 Annual Traffic Report

The Fayetteville Police Department is committed to assisting the citizens and visitors of Fayetteville in traveling its roadways in a safe and efficient manner. The total number of traffic violations cited increased in 2017, and the number of motor vehicle collisions decreased. Statistics regarding motor vehicle collision and various traffic violations are noted below.
