



## FAYETTEVILLE POLICE DEPARTMENT 2018 Annual Traffic Report

The Fayetteville Police Department is committed to assisting the citizens and visitors of Fayetteville in traveling its roadways in a safe and efficient manner. The total number of traffic violations warned and cited, and the total number of accidents, decreased in 2018 over the previous year. Statistics regarding motor vehicle collision and various traffic violations are noted below.
